Continuing Revelation

"Now I find that in a state of pure obedience the mind learns contentment in appearing weak and foolish to that wisdom which is of the world; and in these lowly labors, they who stand in a low place and are rightly exercised under the cross will find nourishment."

After I had given up to go, the thoughts of the journey were often attended with unusual sadness, at which times my heart was frequently turned to the Lord with inward breathings for his heavenly support, that I might not fail to follow him

The Lord had been very gracious, and spoke peace to me in the time of my distress, and I now most ungratefully turned again to folly; at times I felt sharp reproof, but I did not get low enough to cry for help.

Five Questions

- 1. What is the author's main point in this passage? This question gets at what the author's point is, not what you would like it to be. (Main Point)
- 2. What new light do I find in this particular reading of this passage of text? **New light** may be great or small. (New Light)
- 3. How is this passage true **or not true** to my experience? (Truth)
- 4. What are the implications of this passage for my life? (Implications)
- 5. What problems do I have with this passage? (Problems)
